Good people of the Congregational Church of Grafton:



What a cute Baby! Traditional, religious Christmas cards depict an adorable infant, whose innocent face beams brightly from a rustic wooden cradle.

But what of the story of the birth of the "cute" Baby?

The Gospel of Matthew records the birth this way: Joseph awoke from sleep, and he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him to do in his dream. Joseph took Mary as his wife. Mary gave birth to a son. Joseph gave the name Jesus to the Baby. (Matthew 1:24-25)

The Gospel of Luke tells the story of the birth differently: Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. Joseph went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son. (Luke 2:4-7)

The Gospel of John describes the birth with metaphor: *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God....And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.* (John 1:1, 14)

Whichever birth story speaks most acutely to our spiritual sensitivities, we all continue to be fascinated by the Baby.

If political powerhouses had been in charge of a Messiah's incursion into earth, their results-driven personalities may have devised a different strategy: A Jewish storm trooper. Or a Robo-Christ. Invincible, authoritative and authoritarian as an NFL coach or an ultra-stern, stereotypical junior high school principal. "We have ways to make you believe!" Baptism before leaving the birthing room. Church membership at puberty. A year of mission service at age 18. A Bible in every room of the home.

Political icons, however, were not consulted. Instead, a Baby. This Baby is the epitome of helplessness and dependency. Without His mother and her kind husband, God would not have lasted a day. At God's hungry cry, a not-yet-20-year old woman nursed her firstborn. A Palestinian teenage girl rocked God to His first sleep.


If ever there were a model of weakness, it lies in this Baby.

Why do we resist following this model? We still try to bluff and bluster, to posture and pout, to threaten our opponents with meanness or muscle or money to achieve our goals—even under the guise of the Baby's symbolism.

In this holy season, may we emulate God's own strategies: gentleness, invitation and vulnerability.

In this sacred time, may we imitate God's pattern in sending a Baby to do a God-sized job...and not just to think that the Baby is cute.

In this Christmastide, may the Light of the Christ Child transform each of our souls.
